FRIENDS REUNITED (after 33 years!)

In 1973, Paddy McCarron and John Garvey, 2 young men from Baileborough, Co Cavan met each other for the first time, a long way from home here in Sydney.



Paddy then moved out to Dubbo, NSW and the two men lost touch.

In 1988, at the St Patrick's Day Festival in Sydney, Paddy travelled down for the day from Dubbo and recognised John immediately, who was also there, and the two men were delighted to meet each other again.

However, it was not until the 17th November 2021, that the two met each other again! When Paddy eventually moved back to Sydney permanently, he asked around the community to see if anyone knew a John Garvey!

Years passed, but finally low and behold at one of our fortnightly Cara Club meet ups, Denis Carty, another member of the ISA, put Paddy in touch with John.

After 33 years, it was great to witness these two friends reconnect.
