Let the person know that you are there to help and encourage them to seek assistance from a professional. **Make a plan to check in again soon**

RECIPROCAL HEALTHCARE AGREEMENT

Australia and Ireland have a reciprocal healthcare agreement (RHCA) that enables visitors from Ireland to Australia to access medically necessary treatment as inpatients in public hospitals. Medically necessary means that treatment is required before a return to Ireland.

Cover for visitors from Ireland includes;

- Free treatment in a public hospital.
- Subsidised pharmaceuticals under the Pharmaceutical Benefits Scheme.
- Some medically necessary maternity care (The cover depends on visitor type).
- Access to the RHCA requires the provision of a passport as proof that the person is ordinarily resident in Ireland. A valid visa is also required.
- The RHCA does not cover those on student visas.
