Ronan is the founder of Cred, a technology and education company which sets out to inspire others to take care of themselves, others and the planet, every day.





Helen helped us to understand what trauma actually looks like and what we can begin to do in our adult lives to address this and start to move forward.

We explored why Christmas time induces us to spend more money and how can we set boundaries with ourself and others when it comes to Christmas spending.


If you have taken a big hit financially in 2023, we looked at how can we look towards our financial future in 2024 without dread and anxiety.

#### ISA BURIAL PLOTS – ROOKWOOD CEMETE RY



On Saturday 11th November 2023, the ISA held their Annual Mass of Remembrance in St. Mary's Cathedral, Sydney.

This is always a sombre event, but it gives us the opportunity to reflect on our loved ones who we have lost and grieve as a community.

Katerina, our Outreach Worker, takes the flowers each year from the Mass, and lays them on the burial plots that the ISA purchased in 1996 in Rookwood Cemetery. The plots were purchased for those who had no other means of being laid to rest.

To date, 35 people are interred here. In this way, people can be laid to rest with their fellow country people, in peace. Le chéile i gcónaí.
