The motivation for Lisa to organise this fundraising event is a poignant one,



CPR FOR KIDS TRAINING



The Irish Support Agency was delighted to host *CPR for Kids* training on Sunday 5th February in Hugh Bamford Reserve Hall, Bondi.

Over 3 hours, our participants learned evidence-based theory and put it into practice on lifelike baby and child CPR mannequins. We learned how to administer CPR and what to do in case of drowning, fever, burns, choking, poisoning, head injuries and much more. This is such important training for parents and caregivers, and we were delighted to be able to offer this to the Irish Australian community in partnership with the lovely Tara from CPR for Kids Training.
