Such was the workload; it took a second visit across the weekend to finish the job. He reports that his recent bereavement has given him a hugely different perspective on death and bereavement and


a heightened respect for the

rituals associated with church and final resting place. He was particularly moved by the thoughts of people of Irish heritage buried here, so far removed from home without family to respectfully tend to their burial ground. 
DÓCHAS

On Monday 5th September, we were delighted to host our Dóchas webinar, Coping with a serious health event living abroad.



Our guests discussed their individual circumstances and the toll that it has taken on their lives. From the initial shock of receiving the diagnosis, to wanting to better understand how the future might look for

them. Thankfully, all are now on the road to recovery.



We also talked about the healthcare that they each received, and how easy they found it to access support from professionals. It must also be said, that everyone agreed that their friends and family are superstars, and have gone above and beyond to help them on their journey.

On Sunday 21st August, the ramblers ventured from Maroubra beach, along the coast to Coogee Beach. We were blessed with a beautiful morning!



MEMBERSHIP RENEWAL


